KEY MESSAGES

- 1 Using a novel retail food basket approach aligned with the EAT-Lancet reference diet as a proxy for supermarket purchases, the pricing analysis compared the affordability of healthier and less healthy options across countries and retailers. **Healthier retail food baskets were consistently more expensive, with cost differences ranging from 10.8% to 60.6%.** For both healthier and less healthy baskets, the lowest cost was observed at E.Leclerc in France, while the most expensive was found at Naivas in Kenya (PPP USD range: USD 10.76-USD 27.58 vs. USD 8.74-USD 20.84). The greatest and smallest cost disparities between healthier and less healthy baskets were recorded at Robinsons Supermarket in the Philippines and Indomaret in Indonesia, respectively.
- 2 When expressed as percentages of daily per capita gross national income (GNI) and net income, **healthier retail food baskets were consistently less affordable than less healthy baskets across all retailers, with the largest affordability gaps observed in lower- and middle-income countries.** In high-income countries, both the healthy and unhealthy baskets accounted for less than 10% of daily per capita income. In contrast, in lower-middle-income countries, the cost of unhealthy baskets ranged from 36% to 117% of daily per capita GNI, while healthier baskets were even less affordable, accounting for 53% to 154% of daily per capita GNI.
- 3 The findings highlight **the need for retailers, regulatory authorities, and researchers to collaborate in systematically embedding price monitoring data into policy frameworks and ensuring ongoing assessment of food cost and affordability.** Fiscal measures should align food tax rates with public health goals, exploring additional policies that bring greater alignment between subsidies, taxes, and health objectives to reduce the affordability gap and promote equitable access to healthier diets. Finally, collective efforts are essential to increase demand for healthier foods and make them the default, accessible, and preferred choice.

INTRODUCTION

HOW RETAIL FOOD ENVIRONMENTS SHAPE DIETS

Retail food environments—supermarkets, hypermarkets, and other formal retailers—play an increasingly important role in shaping what people eat.^{1,2} They influence purchasing patterns, dietary intake, and health outcomes.³⁻⁵ Changes in retail food environments, characterized by rising per capita sales of unhealthy food and growing grocery sales through e-commerce, have been found to be positively correlated with the prevalence of obesity.³ Given the urgent need to transform food systems to address the pandemic of diet-related non-communicable diseases, it is critical to assess and monitor retail food environments to determine whether they are supporting this transformation.⁶

The key determinants influencing food purchases in formal retail food environments include availability, affordability, and accessibility.⁷ While the development of retail food environments has generally improved the affordability of foods, it has not necessarily enhanced the affordability of foods that, when consumed together, contribute to a healthy dietary pattern.³ It is therefore crucial to investigate foods affordability not just at the level of individual products, but as part of an overall dietary pattern. Although some studies suggest that unhealthy foods or diets are generally more expensive than healthier alternatives, no study has yet evaluated these comparative prices and their affordability within a retail food environment.⁸ Since large retailers now dominate food retail systems in many countries, understanding these price and affordability patterns is key to determining whether they help or hinder healthier eating.³

Several studies have investigated the price and affordability of a diet, including a series of reports from the Food and Agricultural Organization of the United Nations (FAO).⁸⁻¹⁵ Different methods have

been applied to calculate the price and affordability of a diet, which can be further categorized into: (1) a food basket approach; and (2) a data-driven linear programming approach.^{8,12,16} A food basket is a pre-defined list of foods, grouped by food group, in the required quantities, for a reference person or household. Because country-specific dietary guidelines are often challenging to quantify—and are frequently unavailable for low- and middle-income countries (LMICs), a generic food basket is typically applied, such as the “Healthy diet basket” by FAO.⁹

The data-driven diet approach, on the other hand, does not impose requirements at the food group level but instead places restrictions at the dietary pattern level—for example, on total nutrient intake or the overall cost range of the diet. A food basket is then developed based on these restrictions.^{17,18}

ATNi'S PRICING ANALYSIS

For the pricing analysis conducted as part of ATNi's 2025 Retail Assessment, ATNi applied the first option—the mainstream food basket approach—as it best fits the scope and nature of the available datasets. This approach was adapted to the retail context, creating a “retail food basket approach” based on the reference food groups and recommended intakes from the 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet.¹⁹ The first EAT-Lancet reference diet guideline was published in 2019 and served as a reference healthy and sustainable diet. At the time of analysis, EAT-Lancet 2025 had not yet been published; however, this has now been published and changes to the suggested dietary pattern are minimal and use of 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet remains valid for this purpose.

ATNi developed healthy and less healthy baskets for each of the selected retailers in the six target countries: US, France, Indonesia, South Africa, the Philippines, and Kenya, adapting the food groups for cultural relevance and aligning them with the products available at each retailer.

RESEARCH OBJECTIVES

This analysis compared the cost and affordability of healthier and less healthy food baskets—representing typical diets in the selected countries—in relation to national income levels, purchasing power parity (PPP), and other country-specific economic indicators. The research aimed to answer the following question:

Are healthier retail food baskets more or less affordable than less healthy retail food baskets, within and between retailers and countries across different income economies in 2024?



DATA SOURCES

DATA REQUIREMENTS

To calculate the price and affordability of healthier and less healthy food baskets, the following four types of data were required:

- 1 Pricing of individual food products;
- 2 Amount of reference intake per food group;
- 3 Criteria for defining healthier and less healthy foods; and economic indicators for cross-country comparison.

PRICING DATA

Pricing data for food products from retailers in each country for 2024 were obtained from the VIA platform. VIA is a pricing intelligence and e-commerce data platform developed and managed by [Euromonitor International](#). The platform tracks data from online retailers across 40 countries, covering tens of millions of stock keeping units (SKUs), and provides daily updates on pricing, categorization, product attributes, and promotional activity.

For this analysis, the strike-through price was selected instead of the shelf price, as it represents the baseline cost consumers face without promotions or discounts. The regular price provides a consistent, comparable metric across countries and time periods for evaluating how expensive products are relative to income levels, purchasing power, and other economic indicators. The median price of each food product during 2024, in local currency, was used as a proxy for the average price over the year. Of the 18 retailers selected across six countries in the 2025 Retail Assessment, pricing data were available for nine retailers (Table 1).

REFERENCE INTAKE OF FOOD GROUPS: THE EAT-LANCET REFERENCE DIET

The 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet specifies reference intake values (in grams per day) and acceptable ranges around those values for different food groups, based on an average 2,500 kcal/day diet (Table 2). This corresponds to the estimated daily energy needs of a 30-year-old woman weighing 60 kg with a moderate to high level of physical activity.¹¹

The current study did not apply the food-group-specific uncertainty ranges provided by the Commission due to ambiguity in how to substitute across food groups within these ranges.

It is worth noting that the updated version of EAT-Lancet reference diet was published on October 3rd, 2025. The recommended food groups and intake levels have not changed substantially; however, the average optimal energy intake has been revised to 2,400 kcal/day, based on an ideal body mass index of 22 kg/m². The retail food baskets used for this report, based on the original 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet, therefore remain appropriate and valid for comparison.

INDICATORS FOR DEFINING HEALTHIER VS. LESS HEALTHY RETAIL FOOD BASKETS

To determine healthier and less healthy retail food baskets, this analysis used all available supplementary information from the VIA platform. Data included food product categorization, product name, health claims, processing type (fresh, frozen, fried, canned, etc.), grain type, rice type, Nutri-Score, packaging, and product website links. It is important to acknowledge that some products contained missing or incorrect attributes on the VIA platform.

Additional attribute data from VIA, combined with expert judgement, were used to classify food product into healthier or less healthy retail food baskets. This classification was qualitatively evaluated by ATNi researchers. Moreover, the healthier and less healthy baskets were constructed based on relative healthiness—that is, food products were compared and categorized in relation to one another within each retailer’s available products, rather than against a universal or externally defined nutritional standard, as no such unified benchmark was applicable across all food categories in this context.



ECONOMIC INDICATORS

To compare retail food basket prices across countries, prices in local currencies were converted to 2024 USD using PPP exchange rates for private consumption (Table 3). PPP measures the amount of local currency units required to purchase the same bundle of goods and services in each country.

Affordability was assessed relative to each country's per capita gross national income (GNI) and per capita net income (Table 3). Per capita GNI represents the total income earned per person within an economy during a given accounting period and is equal to gross domestic product (GDP) plus earned income received from abroad minus income payable abroad. Per capita net income reflects the average disposable income for expenditure.

PPP conversions and per capita GNI were obtained from the World Bank. Average net income figures were sourced from the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) (for France and the US), national statistics institutions (Indonesia), national banks (South Africa), and local survey institutions (Kenya and the Philippines) (Table 3).

METHODOLOGY

FROM THE EAT-LANCET REFERENCE DIET TO RETAIL FOOD BASKETS

To align the food categories in the VIA platform with those in the 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet, several modifications and substitutions between food groups were made. In this study, whole grains and tubers or starchy vegetables were combined into a single group called “staple foods.”

The EAT-Lancet report specifies which food groups can be substituted for each other, based on their nutritional content and environmental impact. For example, poultry is exchangeable with fish and eggs. Because eggs were not available in the VIA platform dataset, their intake was exchanged to “chicken and other poultry” category (Table 4).

Subsequently, the EAT-Lancet food groups were matched with the corresponding VIA platform food groups (Table 4). An overview of the available products per selected category and retailer is provided in the Appendix (Table A1).

Furthermore, cultural factors (based on food consumption surveys) and the feasibility of industrial reformulation were considered in selecting the staple food group.²⁷⁻³² Bread was included for each retailer since it is widely available in processed forms, making reformulation technically more feasible than other staple food groups such as rice. In addition, for France and the US, dried pasta and frozen processed potatoes were included, while for Indonesia, Kenya, the Philippines, and South Africa, rice, instant noodles, and cooking noodles were selected.

After matching the food groups on the VIA platform with the EAT-Lancet reference diet, the VIA food groups were further categorized using additional product attributes (e.g. processing type, Nutri-score, and health claims) and expert judgement to construct healthier and less healthy retail food baskets for each retailer (Table 5).

The unsaturated edible oil category was treated as neutral in both the healthier and less healthy retail food baskets, including olive, rapeseed, sunflower, and soybean oils. This decision was based on the similar nutritional quality of these oils and aimed to avoid artificially inflating cost differences between the baskets, allowing the analysis to focus on food categories where nutritional contrasts are more pronounced.

^a Please note a possible confounding (price) factor related to the use of frozen rather than fresh fruits and vegetables, which was the only data available in Euromonitor International's VIA platform. In addition, the difference between healthier and less healthy products is more distinct and grounded in scientific consensus in some product categories than in others.

^b For Indomaret (Indonesia) and Naivas (Kenya), several food groups were not available on the VIA platform. To supplement the retail food baskets, additional food products and their current local prices were manually collected from the respective retail e-commerce websites in September 2025. These prices were then converted to estimated 2024 values using each country's average food (price) inflation rate. According to national statistics institutions, the rates were 4.4% for Indonesia and 5.6% for Kenya (Appendix, Table A2).^{33, 34}

PRICE AND AFFORDABILITY ANALYSES

After pre-categorizing relevant food products into healthier and less healthy options within each food group of the retail food basket, the total price of the healthier and less healthy baskets was calculated in local currency for each retailer in each country.

To calculate total basket prices, food products were sampled using a random-loop procedure within predefined food categories to ensure unbiased representation. Each selected product was manually verified, including product name, image, web link, and key attributes (e.g. processing type, health claims, and Nutri-Score). Validation involved confirming that (i) the product belonged to the designated food group, (ii) it met the criteria for inclusion in either the healthier or less healthy basket, and (iii) the size and price information were accurate. A maximum of five products per food group were retained, resulting in approximately 180 products per country for each basket. These were recorded in an Excel-based retail basket database.

For cost estimation, the median price of each food category was multiplied by the corresponding intake amount specified by the EAT-Lancet reference diet. When a single EAT-Lancet food group matched multiple retail food baskets categories, the recommended intake was divided equally across those categories to maintain balance and avoid bias toward any one product type. The resulting costs per category were then calculated to estimate the total cost of the healthier and less healthy retail food baskets in local currency.

Following calculation of total basket costs in local currency, prices for both healthier and less healthy retail food baskets were converted to PPP-adjusted US dollars (Table 3) to enable direct cross-country comparison for 2024.

Affordability was then assessed using two complementary indicators (Table 3). At the micro level, basket costs were expressed as a share of daily per capita net income, indicating the relative affordability across income level. At the macro level, costs were evaluated relative to daily per capita GNI, providing an aggregate measure of economic capacity at the country level.

METHODOLOGICAL LIMITATIONS

Despite the novel approach of constructing healthier and less healthy retail food baskets, and the valuable cross-country insights, it is worth noting that the food basket approach for assessing food affordability has been increasingly applied and validated for this purpose.¹¹ Nevertheless, several methodological limitations must be acknowledged.

- **Representativeness of the baskets:** The retail food baskets do not capture the full price distribution of products available in each country. While the VIA platform provides a broad range of retail food prices for each retailer, overall data quality is uneven, and many products require manual verification. Conducting such validation across the entire VIA database would demand significant resources and was beyond the scope of this study. Consequently, the baskets reflect a subset of products rather than the complete market distribution for each retailer.
- **Retail food baskets cover food products available in formal food environments:** The retail food baskets were constructed using food groups and products available on the VIA platform for the selected retailers. However, fruit and vegetable data were mostly limited to frozen rather than fresh options. Furthermore, in many LMIC settings, informal markets account for a substantial share of food purchases, which are not shared in this analysis.
- **Limited number of retailers per country:** For the overall Retail Assessment, three retailers were selected per country based on market share; however, price data on the VIA platform were available for only one or two of these retailers per country. This limited coverage reduces the generalizability of the findings. Moreover, as the pricing data were sourced from e-commerce platforms, the analysis could not fully capture retail diversity, regional price variations, or market segmentation within each country.

- Definition of healthier and less healthy baskets:** The categorization of foods into “healthier” and “less healthy” baskets was guided by available product information and expert knowledge, informed by empirical evidence linking specific food group and nutrients to health outcomes, and aligning with dietary guidelines. For example, whole grain staples were classified as healthier than refined white staples, reflecting evidence of their associations with a lower risk of chronic diseases.³⁵ These classifications were further adapted based on product availability in each retail context. While this approach minimizes arbitrariness, it still introduces some subjectivity and potential variation between countries. The resulting baskets should therefore be understood as indicative rather than absolute representations of healthier and less healthy diets.
- Energy requirements and population diversity:** The cost estimates are based on intake recommendations for a reference person as defined by the 2019 EAT-Lancet Commission. This standardized approach facilitates comparability across contexts but does not account for different energy requirements among population groups such as children, adolescents, or individuals with high physical activity levels. These within population differences are addressed in the updated EAT-Lancet recommendations (October 2025). However, the current analysis could not adopt the updated framework due to the study’s scope and timeframe. It also remains uncertain whether the results would differ substantially if the retail food baskets were adapted for specific subpopulations.
- Economic indicators and data availability:** Affordability was assessed using per capita net income as the micro-level indicator. However, official data on net income are not consistently available across countries. In cases where direct measures were missing, proxy indicators or secondary data sources were used. This approach may reduce comparability and introduce some uncertainty into cross-country analyses.
- Scope of the affordability (non-monetary and indirect costs not included):** The analysis assesses affordability strictly as the monetary cost of the retail food baskets relative to income. It does not capture non-monetary or indirect costs that influence the real-world affordability of diets, such as:
 - time costs of meal planning, shopping, queuing, and cooking;
 - fuel/energy and water required for preparation;
 - access to equipment, refrigeration, and safe storage;
 - transport and delivery fees;
 - opportunity costs of caregiving or paid work forgone; and
 - potential food waste due to perishability or package size.

Excluding these dimensions may over- or under-estimate effective affordability, particularly for time-poor or resource-constrained households.
- Supplementation with external data for Naivas (Kenya) and Indomaret (Indonesia):** For Naivas and Indomaret, certain food groups were not available on the VIA platform. To address these gaps, additional products and prices were obtained from e-commerce websites and in-store prices collected in September 2025. As frozen fruits were unavailable for both retailers, fresh fruits were substituted in the healthier retail food basket. Although the prices were adjusted to 2024 levels using national food inflation rates (Appendix, Table A2), reliance on one-time-point data introduces potential bias, as temporary price fluctuations may not accurately reflect longer-term averages.

RESULTS

COST OF RETAIL FOOD BASKETS

Across all countries and retailers, healthier baskets were consistently more expensive than less healthy ones (Figure 1). In 2024, the cost of a healthier basket ranged from USD 10.76 to USD 27.58 per person per day, compared with USD 8.74 to USD 20.84 for a less healthy basket (Table 6).

The cheapest healthier and less healthy baskets were observed at E.Leclerc in France, while the most expensive baskets were found at Naivas in Kenya (Figure 1). Overall, retailers in high-income countries (France and the US) consistently offered the lowest-cost baskets, while those in LMICs (Indonesia, South Africa, the Philippines, and Kenya) had higher costs (Figure 1).

The cost of a healthier retail food basket was consistently higher than that of a less healthy basket from the same retailer (Figure 2). However, the difference varied considerably across countries and retailers. At Robinsons Supermarket in the Philippines, healthier baskets were 60.6% more expensive, while at

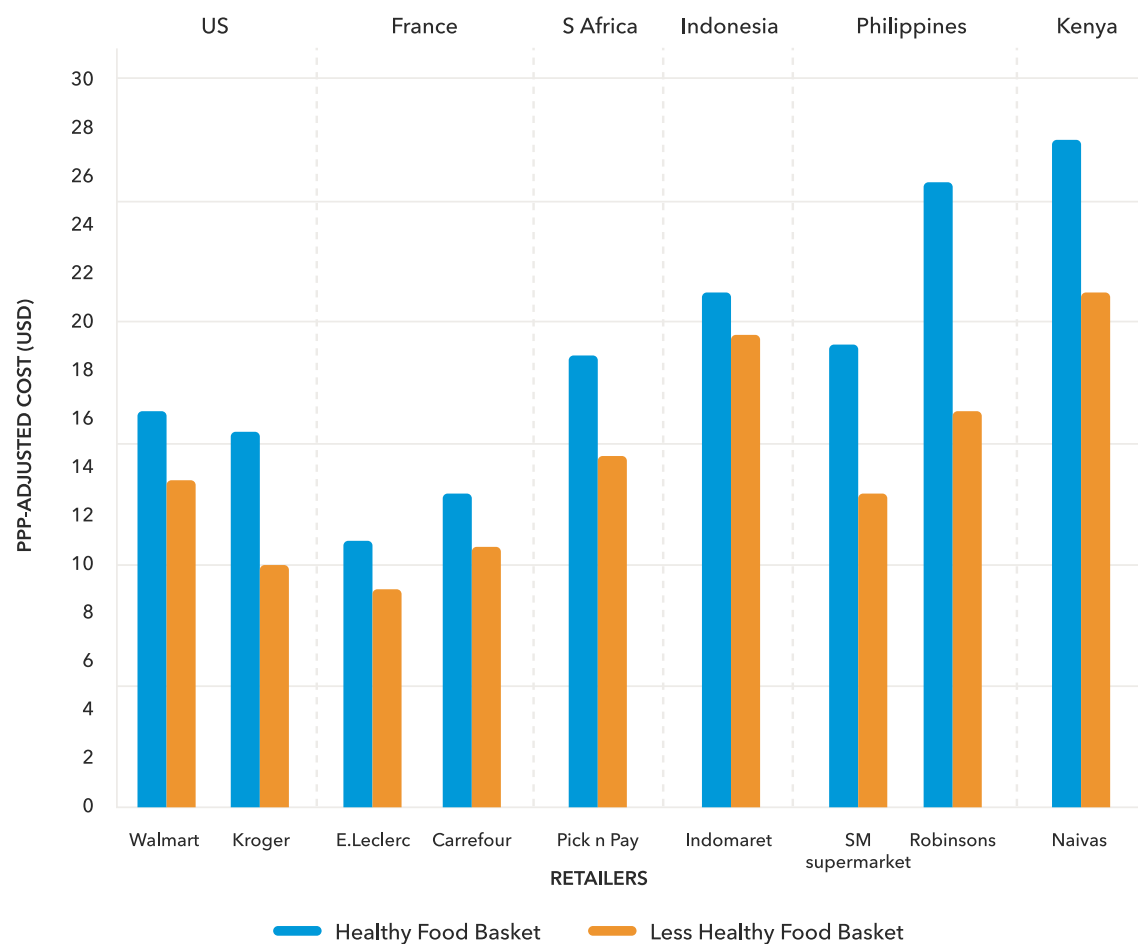
Indomaret in Indonesia, the gap was smaller at 10.8% (Table 6). The cost disparity between healthier and less healthy baskets was comparable between the two French retailers—Carrefour (23.9%) and E.Leclerc (23.1%) (Figure 2 and Table 6).

AFFORDABILITY OF RETAIL FOOD BASKETS

The healthier retail food basket was less affordable than the less healthy basket across all retailers (Figure 3). The affordability of healthier baskets, as a percentage of daily per capita GNI, ranged from 6.27% at E.Leclerc (France) to 154.40% at Naivas (Kenya), while the less healthy baskets ranged from 4.20% at Kroger (US) to 116.69% at Naivas (Kenya), respectively (Table 7). Both healthier and less healthy retail food baskets at Naivas were the least affordable compared to other retailers, which is in line with the cost of the retail food baskets, as Naivas had their higher PPP-adjusted costs (Figure 1).

When measured as a proportion of daily per capita net income, the affordability of healthier retail food baskets ranged from 8.99% at E.Leclerc (France) to 100.10% at Indomaret (Indonesia), while the less healthy basket ranged from 6.76% at Kroger (US) to 90.38% at Indomaret (Table 7). Although the absolute costs of both baskets at Indomaret in Indonesia were not the highest, they were the least affordable when expressed as a percentage of net income (Figure 3).

Both economic indicators showed that retail food baskets (both healthier and less healthy) were most affordable at retailers in the US (Walmart and Kroger) and France (Carrefour and E.Leclerc), followed by Pick n Pay in South Africa and SM Supermarket and Robinsons Supermarket in the Philippines (Figure 3). Although the cost of retail food baskets at Indomaret (Indonesia) represented the largest share of daily per capita net income, they were relatively more affordable when expressed as a percentage of per capita GNI (48.90% for the healthier basket and 44.16% for the less healthy basket, respectively) (Table 7). At Naivas (Kenya), both baskets were the least affordable when measured by daily per capita GNI and were only slightly more affordable than Indomaret when measured by daily per capita net income (Figure 3).

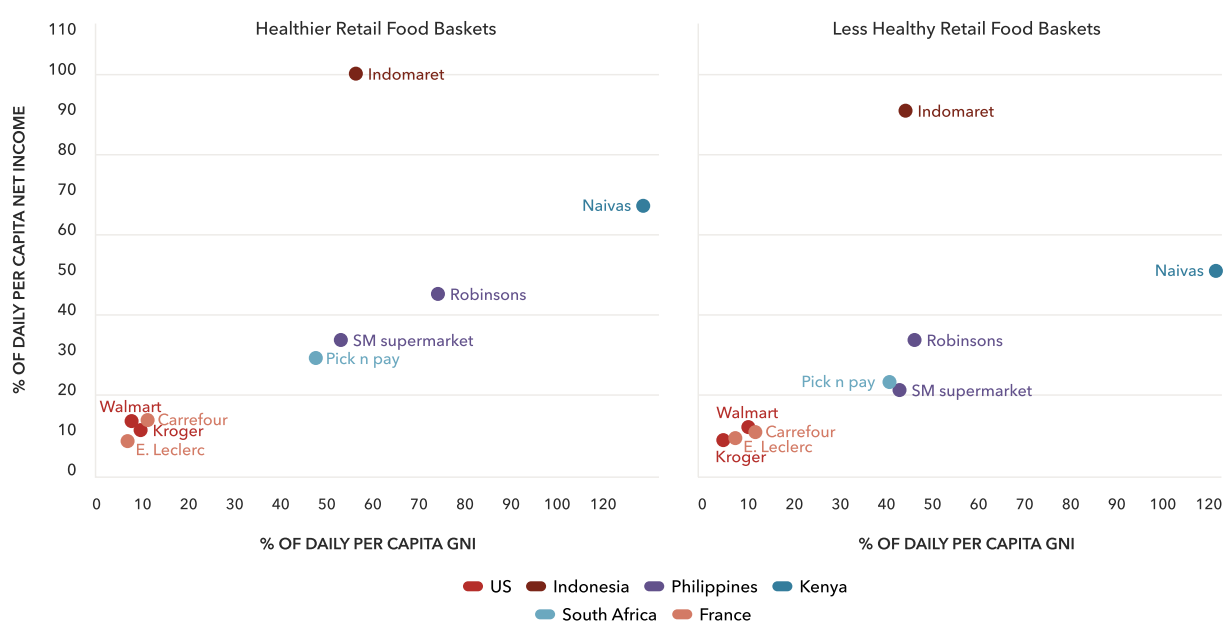

DISCUSSION

This pricing analysis applied a novel approach, grounded in the 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet, to estimate the cost and affordability of healthier and less healthy food products, represented by corresponding retail food baskets from nine retailers across six countries in 2024. The findings highlight persistent affordability challenges for healthier diets and the importance of integrating cost and affordability considerations into nutrition policy.

Retailers can play a role in closing this gap by prioritizing healthier yet affordable manufacturer brand products, improving the healthiness of retail products, aligning marketing and promotional strategies with public health goals, and supporting affordability initiatives.

Across all countries and retailers, healthier baskets were consistently more expensive and less affordable than less healthy ones. This finding is consistent with previous systematic reviews and meta-analyses showing that healthier dietary patterns tend to be more costly than less healthy ones, whether assessed by daily intake or per 2,000 kcal.³⁶ Other studies in the US have similarly found that increased food spending is associated with improved diet quality.^{37,38}

Although many retailers and policy initiatives aim to improve the affordability of healthier foods, this cost differential at the food basket level suggests that such efforts have not yet translated into substantial shifts in retail pricing. This persistent price gap is likely to influence consumer purchasing behaviour, particularly among price-sensitive or marginalized groups, who may opt for less healthy but cheaper options—potentially exacerbating inequalities in diet quality and health outcomes.³⁹

The results are consistent with broader analyses of diet affordability across countries of varying income levels. For example, a global study assessing the affordability of the 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet using 2011 data found that affordability was lowest in Kenya, lower in

Indonesia, the Philippines, and South Africa, and highest in France and the US when measured as a percentage of daily per capita GNI.¹¹

It is noteworthy that the current study applied a retailer basket approach, collecting prices from selected retailers, which may better represent what consumers pay. In contrast, the earlier EAT-Lancet affordability study relied on standardized commodity prices.¹¹ Similarly, studies by FAO, the World Bank, and other organizations have shown that lower-income and LMICs face a disproportionately heavy burden in meeting the cost of nutrient-adequate diets.¹³ Using this retail food basket approach, the findings are comparable to previous studies where lower-income countries show more constrained affordability as well as higher PPP-adjusted nominal prices.

A notable finding is that at Indomaret in Indonesia, the retail food baskets represent a high percentage of daily per capita net income but a lower percentage of per capita GNI. This suggests that although national economic growth has been strong, household-level incomes have not risen proportionately. Large informal sectors, regional disparities, and income inequality may drive improvements in macroeconomic indicators without corresponding gains in individual purchasing power.⁴⁰

Conversely, in Kenya, the baskets account for a high percentage of daily per capita GNI but a slightly lower percentage of daily per capita net income. This may indicate that certain population segments experience relatively better purchasing power than national GNI figures suggest, or that income distribution patterns influence the relationship between macroeconomic indicators and household affordability.⁴¹ However, this analysis does not allow for robust interpretation of these observations, and further research is warranted to validate these findings.

The current pricing analysis has several strengths. First, the study introduces a novel retailer-based basket approach, distinguishing between healthier and less healthy food baskets. This method enables a more granular assessment of actual retail prices as experienced by consumers, rather than relying solely on aggregated commodity prices or generalized diet models. By capturing differences at the retailer level, the analysis provides actionable insights for policymakers, retailers and other stakeholders on affordability and access challenges within real-world retail food environments.

Second, the healthier basket is anchored in the healthy and sustainable 2019 EAT-Lancet reference diet, ensuring that the analysis is guided by internationally recognized nutrition and sustainability standards.¹⁹ This alignment strengthens the study's relevance for public health and nutrition policy by linking observed costs directly to dietary patterns that support both human and planetary health.

Lastly, the standardized basket composition enabled cross-country comparisons and strengthened the robustness and comparability of results across diverse economic contexts. The analysis also incorporated economic indicators at both micro- and macro-levels, providing a more nuanced understanding of affordability and purchasing power.

Nevertheless, several methodological limitations should be considered when interpreting the results. Certain discrepancies between healthier and less healthy retail food baskets in specific retailers—such as Naivas in Kenya and Indomaret in Indonesia—should be interpreted with caution. For example, frozen fruits were unavailable in the pricing data source (Euromonitor International's VIA Platform), likely reflecting limited access and development in cold chain infrastructure. Consequently, fresh fruit substitutes were used in the healthier baskets for these retailers. In addition, the substituted prices were collected at a single point in September 2025; although inflation adjustments were applied, seasonal variation and supply fluctuations could not be fully accounted for.



It is also important to note that the retail food baskets represent the cost of a “retail diet”, rather than actual dietary patterns or food purchasing behaviours. In countries such as Indonesia, the Philippines, and Kenya, where informal markets remain major sources of food—reliance on formal retailers is lower.⁴² Consequently, retail baskets may overestimate household food expenditures or price exposures, which may partly explain the higher observed costs and lower affordability in these contexts.

Finally, while the analysis provides valuable insights, the results should be interpreted as indicative rather than definitive. The limited number of countries, the focus on selected retailers, and reliance on a relatively narrow set of food products limit overall representativeness.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The findings offer valuable insights for **retailers, policy makers, and researchers.**

Previous research using the Healthy Food Environment Policy Index (Food-EPI) found that, among various policy domains aimed at creating healthy food environments, food retail policies had the lowest level of implementation. This indicates that measures such as regulating food promotions, product placement, and measures to improve the availability of healthier options in retail settings were less developed compared to policies in areas like nutrition education or school food environments.⁴³ **Results from the current analysis on the cost and affordability of healthier and less healthy retail food baskets can help retailers to self-monitor policies related to affordability.** Potentially, an assessment toolkit on the affordability of 'retail food baskets' could be developed for this purpose to better monitor the implementation of such policies in the food retail sector.

Partnerships among retailers, policymakers, and researchers are also needed to **continuously monitor the pricing data and cost and affordability of food baskets structurally, and align pricing strategies and source suppliers with health goals** to close the gap between healthier and less healthy baskets, especially in lower-middle and upper-middle income countries.

At national level, governments should consider **fiscal measures that structurally reduce the price gaps and to make healthier foods accessible and affordable** for all, such as subsidies for healthier foods and tax incentives to lower costs of healthier foods.⁴⁴ A pooled systematic review and meta-analysis has shown that price reductions can lead to increased purchases of fruit and vegetables, potentially sufficient to generate health benefits if sustained.⁴⁵ Thus, **structural fiscal measures can have potential nutritional and health benefits if designed, implemented, and monitored appropriately.**⁴⁴

Besides fiscal policies, public policies supporting an overall healthy retail food environment is important for consumers to make healthier food choices more easily.⁴⁶ Measures such as **nutrition labelling and limiting promotions for less healthy foods have proven to be robust and effective in modifying diet-related outcomes**, including consumer purchasing of healthier foods, healthier dietary behaviours, and health benefits.⁴⁷

Therefore, **a holistic package of fiscal measures should be used to support public health targets, particularly in LMICs.**^{44,48}

Future research is needed to validate and refine the retail food basket approach, including expanding the number of countries, retailers, and a wider spectrum of food products, and repeated data collection over the years to monitor variations in cost and affordability. Research should also incorporate consumer perspectives, particularly on purchasing behaviour, price sensitivity, and perceived affordability among vulnerable groups.^{49,50} In countries where informal markets play a dominant role, such as Indonesia and Kenya, it is important to compare affordability between formal retail and informal markets to better capture the full food environment.⁴² Finally, longitudinal research is needed to evaluate whether fiscal measures, retailer pricing strategies, or other interventions effectively improve the affordability and consumption of healthier diets.

GLOSSARY

Food environments	The physical, economic, political, and sociocultural factors that influence individual's food choices and access to food. Food environments are typically divided into two broad categories: natural and built environments.
Strike-through price	The price at which a product has been offered for sale for a reasonable period prior to a promotion or discount, used as a reference point to indicate a price reduction to consumers.
Shelf price	The price displayed on the store shelf or electronic label for a product, representing the current retail selling price and including any promotions.
EAT-Lancet reference diet (2019)	A global dietary framework proposed by the EAT-Lancet Commission to promote both human health and environmental sustainability. It is a flexible, plant-forward diet in which whole grains, fruits, vegetables, nuts, and legumes make up the majority of daily intake, while animal-sourced foods such as meat and dairy are included in smaller amounts. The guidelines provide recommended intake ranges for major food groups, with an average daily energy target of 2,500 kcal for adults.
Purchasing power parity (PPP)	A measure of the price of specific goods in different countries used to compare the absolute purchasing power of the country's currency.
PPP-adjusted USD	The equalized cost of good and services in different countries measured in terms of national currency per USD. For this assessment, food baskets were used. Example calculation: Demo healthy diet cost EUR 14.93 in 2024, and the PPP conversion rate for 2024 is 1 euro = USD 1.19, then the PPP-adjusted cost in USD would be $\text{EUR } 14.93 * 1.19 = \text{USD } 17.75$ (PPP-adjusted USD)
Per capita gross national income (GNI)	The total amount of factor incomes earned by the residents of a country, divided by its midyear population, providing a measure of average economic prosperity. The total amount of factor incomes is equal to gross domestic product (GDP), plus factor incomes received from non-residents by residents, minus factor income paid by residents to non-residents.
Daily per capita net income	The average amount of disposable income available per person per day after taxes and other deductions.
